### **October Technical Meeting**

ES&H Professionals
Integrating Into Business
Success

Integrating the full aspects of environmental, safety, and health (ES&H) practices into the traditional business model reflects a business philosophy beyond compliance. Achieving business success requires organizations to predict and prevent failures – including ES&H. Too often, organizations apply a failure-based philosophy to ES&H that requires spending key business

dollars on recovery efforts rather than on preventative measures. Adoption of a qualitative risk model beyond traditional hazards analyses proves a powerful tool to understand relative business risks. Consistent use of a single "simple" risk matrix with the appropriate definitions of consequence and frequency across various business aspects, beyond safety, provides an organization the ability to compare business risks – that includes the integration of ES&H into the business model.
