Thoughts and Takeaways from ASSP **Leadership Conference**

Hello, New Mexico Chapter! Gary Wright here. I am the NM ASSP Chapter Secretary, and I was fortunate enough to attend the recent ASSP Leadership conference in Chicago, Illinois. The Leadership Conference is a chance for volunteer leaders to network and learn from safety professionals from around the globe. Attendees also receive leadership training, team building, and problem-solving skills enhancing the success of the members as well as their Chapters.

One focus of the conference was that as Safety Professionals, we are all leaders. What we do and how we interact with our customers will influence how they react to safety. Safety cops get a lot of resistance, but Safety Leaders speak with the workers and not at them. They place their focus on keeping the workers safe, through education and cooperation. This leads to a stronger safety culture our overarching goal.

Another takeaway from the conference also dealt with Leadership from the "Leading for Impact" dialogue. This discussion centered on encouraging members to use their skills as Leaders, to lead their local ASSP chapters. Volunteering doesn't have to be limited to the Executive Committee. There are several other ways to get involved, such as volunteering for subcommittees. participating in professional development conferences, or being a speaker at a technical meeting. And that's just at the local level. There are even more ways to get involved at the national (Society) level.

My final takeaway came from the "Successful Succession Planning" breakout, or how the current **Executive Committee** successfully passes down information to the incoming Executive Committee. The Executive Committee holds a transition meeting each year, but there is some loss of detail. During the discussion at the Leadership

Conference, the presenters mentioned 3 key areas: identify opportunities, define opportunities, and invite volunteers.

We identify opportunities toward the end of every ASSP year, typically in April or May. This is when we ask the Chapter for Executive Committee nominations. These openings are President, Vice President, President Elect, Treasurer, and Secretary. We also ask for volunteers to help with planning the Professional Development Conference, but there are many other opportunities, such as Membership Committee Chair, Social Media Chair, and Government Relations Chair.

When Chapters have a robust succession plan, they see better Chapter morale, less Executive Committee turnover, and better member involvement. If you have any questions about volunteering, please reach out to any Executive Committee member today.
