Healthy Habits Make Everyday Sense

Following these everyday guidelines from the World Health Organization will safeguard your health and that of other attendees at any public event.

ASSP New Mexico

- Wash your hands frequently -- Regularly clean your hands using soap and warm water for 20 seconds. Use alcohol-based hand sanitizer in-between hand washings and after touching common surfaces such as doorknobs, railings, and tables.
- Practice good
 respiratory hygiene When coughing or
 sneezing, cover your
 nose and mouth with a
 tissue or your bent
 elbow. Dispose of used
 tissues immediately. If
 you inadvertently cough

or sneeze into your hands, wash your hands right away. Don't share food, utensils, cups, or anything else that might contain germs.

- Maintain social distancing -- Stay at least 3 feet away from anyone who is coughing or sneezing. This helps prevent exposure to illness.
- Avoid touching your face -- Hands touch many common surfaces and can easily transfer a virus to your eyes, nose, or mouth. That is a typical way people get sick.
- Stay home when feeling ill -- If you have a fever, cough, and difficulty breathing, stay home

and seek medical care early. It is best to call your healthcare provider in advance so they can direct you to the proper healthcare facility.
